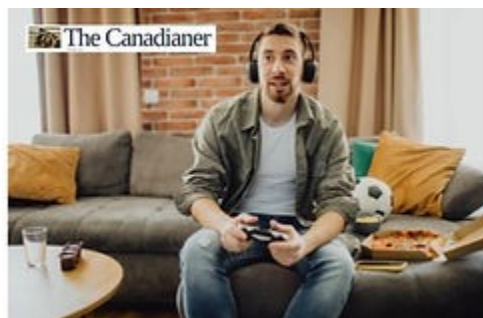
Alberta forms ‘Measle Party’ - threatens to rub against rest of Canada.

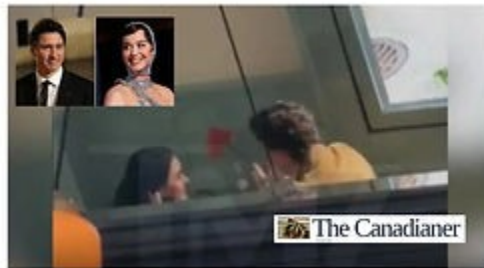
B.C. man who punched cougar in the face put in charge of all Canada/U.S. relations.
